Instead of a blanket prohibition against media coverage, allowance for 21 media coverage should be granted on a case-by-case basis in accordance with California Rule of Court 1.150 22 in order to allow for citizens' access to the Court<sup>1</sup>. 23 Media coverage may be permitted by written order of the court. See Cal. Rul. Ct. 1.150(e). Factors 24 to be considered when determining a request for media coverage include, but are not limited to: the importance 25 of maintaining public trust and confidence in the judicial system, the importance of promoting public access to 26 27 28 <sup>1</sup>The County of San Diego Superior Court also issued a General Order on December 27, 2021 regarding

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the judicial system; and the nature of the case<sup>2</sup>. See Cal. Rul. Ct. 1.150(e)(3)(A), Cal. Rul. Ct. 1.150(e)(3)(B), Cal. Rul. Ct. 1.150(e)(3)(D).

Plaintiff's lawsuit claims that he was attacked by Arambula when Arambula was acting as an elected City Council Member and that the attack occurred while Arambula was conducting official City business. Because the City is a defendant to this case, coverage of the trial may be pertinent to the City's constituents who are interested in and want to remain informed on City related matters and business. If the media were to cover any portions of the trial, in accordance with the California Rules of Court, it would provide for fair access to the Court for all interested parties who may be unavailable to otherwise observe the trial.

Based on the foregoing, Defendants' request for a blanket-prohibition against media coverage at trial should be denied.
